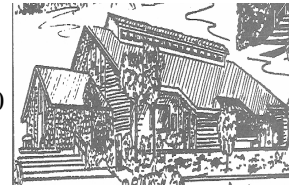

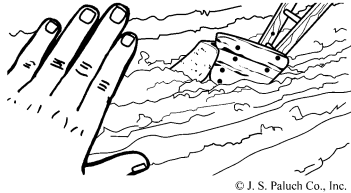

FOLLOW FAITHFULLY

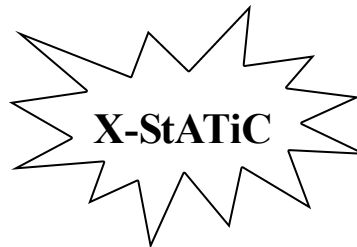
When Elijah calls Elisha to follow him, Elisha goes back, momentarily, to finish some business at home. But note that he does not leave the work to be done by those at home, nor does he plan to come back and finish it himself. He recognizes in Elijah's call that he must follow faithfully and not look back.

Psalm 16 celebrates the loving protection of God for those who depend on God's love and mercy. God is our portion and cup, in a line seen by Christians as a poetic reference to Eucharist, and God will not abandon us to death and corruption, but will call us into the holy Presence forever. This could be seen as resurrection, something that was not universally believed in the days before Jesus. We are assured that if we go forth in confidence to follow God's daily call, we will not be shamed or abandoned, but will find the life we seek.

BLESSED JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784) July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan *padre* who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Blessed Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



For those who attend other parishes and read their bulletins, I think we share a common theme this year. The recession or economic woes are hitting parishes too as much as your income is affected by the downturn and world market events. We have done everything humanly possible to cut costs this past year, reducing electrical usage, trying to conserve and manage our resources, re-amortizing our building loan and we are coming up short. As you read in the Sunday bulletin our weekly income is not meeting our budgeted goal. The Finance committee did budget a generous amount for fund raising this past year and we fell short of that mark. Knowing that we are not going to raise \$50,000 over and above Sunday collections, we rely heavily on Sunday collections to meet expenses. This means that if we were paying our previous loan payments we would be down \$20K. So, any way you look at it, we need every contributing family to consider an additional \$100 before the end of the fiscal year. I know this may be a stretch for some households but we need every household to sacrifice some amount so that we can meet our financial goals. Thank you for your prayerful consideration.

On a brighter note, I am so delighted how our informal neighborhood gatherings are going. The host couples are doing such a great job, inviting people in their neighborhoods to their homes. Some hosts are sending email invitations, or evite invitations, and then following up with phone calls or even door to door visits inviting those who are registered in the parish to these evening gatherings. People are sometimes hesitant thinking there is some hidden agenda.

The plan for these weekend evenings is quite simple, building relationships, creating bridges between parishioners who worship at different Masses by getting to know one another through personal story telling, or engaging in creative ice-breakers around a meal whether sharing hors d' oeuvres, appetizers or a pot-luck. Each gathering is unique because each neighborhood has its own character and quality. What is consistent is the warm spirit of hospitality shared by the host couples or hostesses with the people who attend. People are having a great time. So, when someone from your neighborhood invites you to one of these gatherings, please say yes and attend. If for some reason you will be out of town or have another commitment that is OK because we are going to continue having these gatherings over at least the next two years.

It is my hope that some groups may choose to meet at least once a year on their own to foster the spirit of hospitality at Saint Anthony parish and welcome any new families that choose to worship here. It is all of our responsibility to ensure that everyone who comes to Mass feels welcome, accepted, and encouraged to participate in the faith life of this parish community. So far, you are doing well greeting new families, introducing yourselves, and helping people feel welcome. How would it feel if each family could invite another family, or another person to participate and worship here?
