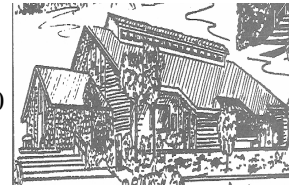

ANOINTING & CARE OF THE SICK

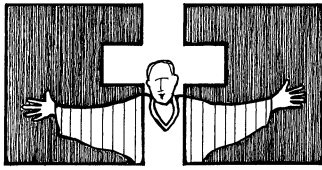

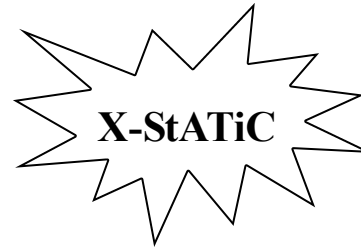
SAINT MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902) July 6

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year old son Alessandro repositioned her barely twelve-year old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times. As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned, unrepentant, Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm in arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.

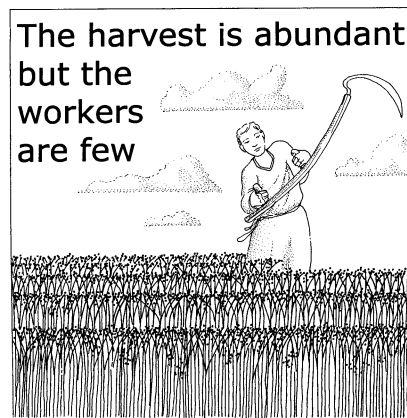

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Today we celebrate the anniversary of “The Declaration of Independence” declared by Congress on July 4, 1776. Each citizen, each person probably studied the Declaration either in US Government class, during preparations for becoming a citizen or simply studying United States history once upon a time. For those blessed with great memories, some committed this document to memory. I believe that we were required to learn the first two paragraphs of this declaration written primarily by Thomas Jefferson in one of those classes in my youth, though I confess I would be hard pressed to recite it now.

It is a remarkable, masterful document eloquent in its content, succinct in its prose, and incredible in its thought development laying out the premise of the eventual separation of the States from British rule. It touches so many elements of our nation’s stature, our founding father’s intent, and the core beliefs of who we are next to the Constitution of the United States.

Every year I think that I will re-read the declaration and a few of the many commentaries readily available on the internet from various sites and sources. Maybe I will get to it this year.

Most of us mark the day with prayer, sometimes attending a local parade, gathering with family and friends over BBQ and simply enjoying the holiday especially when it is part of a three day weekend. We may choose to watch fireworks up close or at least on television taking in the music and festivities on the Capitol Mall in Washington, D.C every year. It is a remarkable day to recall what our forebears did to establish the framework for those 13 states through the work of the Second Continental Congress and the wisdom of our first leaders. What courage did it take to issue this document and the courage to follow through to make this document a reality?

I believe our forebears were resolute in their decisions fully aware of the pending consequences of this declaration and its accompanying implications. We pray that our current leaders can find the wisdom, courage and strength to lead us through the current economic difficulties with equal determination. There are no easy fixes to our current dilemmas, but we certainly can pray for our city, state and national leaders regardless of party or affiliation as they struggle with each day’s decisions.

Similarly are we equally resolute in following Christ, living out the Gospel directives found in the Beatitudes, found in the very mission of Jesus to go out to every town and place proclaiming God’s Good News? We are called to be instruments of God’s peace announcing that the Kingdom of God is at hand.

Together we can be grateful for the work of our forebears, grateful for the ministry and mission of Christ, grateful for all that God gives to us. Happy Fourth of July!
