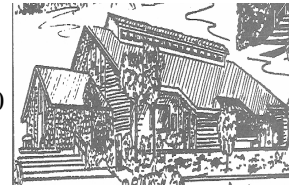

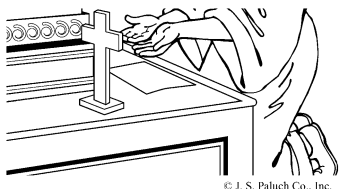

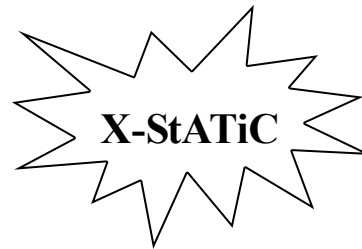

February 3rd – Saint Blaise, Bishop & Martyr

"The Presentation" has been celebrated since the fourth century and has undergone its share of changes over the centuries. In the East, this feast is known as the "Encounter" or "Meeting"; that is, the meeting of the baby Jesus with Simeon who recognized Christ as "a light to reveal God to the nations." Mass today usually begins with the blessing of candles and the procession. These candles are used for the blessing of the throats on February 3rd. People may also bring to Mass their own candles that they will use in their homes and work places this next year so that these candles may be blessed as well.

"Blessing of the Throats" is the feast day of Saint Blaise, because legend says that he cured a young boy choking on a fish bone. On this day the blessing may be given by touching the throat of each person with two candles that are formed in the Sign of a Cross or, if there are a great number of people who have gathered, the blessing may be given over the people while saying the prayer of blessing.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Last Sunday like many people I turned on the AFC playoff game between the San Francisco 49ers and the New York Giants, not that I watch sports with any regularity mind you. And I saw the botched punt return of Kyle Williams denying the 49ers the trip to the Super Bowl. Unlike some professional athletes Williams accepted full responsibility for his actions, actions that he will live with for the rest of his life. Actions that only those passionately involved in sports may choose to remember five or even ten years from now. After all, when all is said and done, it is only a game. But, here comes the but, but where does it say that a player who makes such a mistake deserves to receive death threats through social media? Where does it say that we can purportedly make anonymous threats of that nature to another human being and seemingly be serious? Many sports' journalists are spending time and words expressing their thoughts on the subject as they will after the Super Bowl and comment on the mistakes made by the team that loses. What mistakes did this or that player make? What opportunities went unfulfilled? Regardless of the price of the tickets, or the salaries paid to the players, it is an athletic contest, no more, no less.

At the end of the day, what difference does that make in the cosmic scheme of things? But, more importantly how do we demonstrate respect for human life in all its forms. On Monday we passed over once more the Supreme Court decision Roe vs Wade, granting the right for individuals to chose to end a pregnancy by abortion. Where is the right of the fetus to decide whether he or she wishes to live or die? Does not the unborn have the right to life? Who is the advocate for the unborn?

In addition, there are a litany of issues facing us every single day from economic justice, to the right of people to migrate, ending the death penalty, just compensation for workers, to name just a few of the church's positions on the fundamental right to life for every human person regardless of education, economic status, cultural background or belief system. We live in increasingly complicated times, where decisions are either imposed or stripped from the person in an ever increasingly hostile world to justice and human rights to preserve our human dignity, and the inherent responsibilities that each person must fulfill as a child of God.

What I take away from last week's game is that Mr. Williams will learn from his mistakes, do his best not to repeat it, and accept responsibility for his actions. As Catholic Christians we can do no less to learn from our past mistakes, do our best not to repeat them, and take responsibility to bring about the kingdom of God here on earth by demonstrating our true Christian love for one another, respecting life at all stages and phases and advocating for those who are powerless to do so on their own.
